





HOW TO USE THIS WORKBOOK




- 1 Fill in the workbook as you work through it.




PURPOSE...

APPROPRIATE AUTHENTIC ALLYSHIP ACTIONS



- 1 Make way for Indigenous Peoples to speak for themselves (or ensure they consent in advance to you speaking for them).
Why? Giving Indigenous Peoples the stage ensures their voice is heard.
- 2 Check out Indigenous art (such as paintings, music and beadwork).
Why? This presents an easy way to build understanding.
- 3 Identify problematic behaviours and encourage enlightenment through positive re-direction.
Why? Assumptions and stereotypes have contributed to discrimination against Indigenous Peoples in Canada for generations.



AUTHENTIC ALLYSHIP LETS INDIGENOUS PEOPLES LEAD

An approach repeatedly attempted by Canadian politicians and judges has been to decide what will help Indigenous communities and impose their "fixes" upon them.

The approach repeatedly enacted by the government, education, medical, and justice systems are to decide for themselves what Indigenous Peoples need and impose more colonial oppression upon them.

Authentic allyship embraces collaboration.

It involves understanding that Indigenous Peoples should direct the conversation about what can be done to help.

Indigenous Peoples are the best situated to know what they need.
